Wastewater Replacement Project: The contractor must return later this spring to address some ground settling issues. Most importantly it was discovered that the contractor applied an outdated DOL Wage Decision pertaining to the mandatory payment of Davis-Bacon wage rates. This resulted in an underpayment of wages in the gross amount of \$4,081.99. Rectifying this does not appear to present a problem, and it is still being determined how best to make this up, but likely through a project change order.
